

Stigmas Surrounding Diabetes

As a diabetic I find it hard to continuously listen to assumptions that people have surrounding diabetes.

First of all, diabetes (specifically type 1) is NOT caused by consuming too much sugar. It's an auto-immune condition that is triggered when the body mistakenly attacks beta cells in the pancreas as a result of having a virus like COVID or maybe an allergic reaction.

Although type 1 diabetes can appear at any age, there are two noticeable peaks. The first occurs in children between 4 and 7 years old, and the second is in children between 10 and 14 years old.

At age 5 I was diagnosed with type 1 diabetes and I have recently discovered that this may be due to having very bad chicken pox about six months earlier. Some main symptoms before diagnosis are; feeling thirsty all the time, drinking more water than normal, going to the toilet more (generally through the night), having blurry vision, feeling shaky and getting headaches, feeling tired more than usual and unintentionally losing weight.

Please be mindful about the people around you as diabetes isn't often seen. People often aren't aware that you could be diabetic as there aren't usually any physical indications of it. I wear an insulin pump and I often get very anxious in the corridors because people are always pushing and shoving each other and if someone was to barge into me, my pod off could be ripped off (which would be painful).

The last thing is that when I'm stood with a group of people sometimes I hear, "you could catch a disease like diabetes" or "you'll get diabetes if you eat that" and sometimes it can be really hurtful and when you see the age range of the people that assume things it can be quite surprising. Nearly 4 million people in the UK have been diagnosed.

WWDC22 Apple Event

(This article may be biased in some areas as I am an Apple enthusiast and user) (If you see me comparing one thing to another, I am comparing the M1 and M2 chip versions)

WWDC22 was quite impressive and now the benchmarks are in, and we can see the specs of the new M2 chips. When you get the 256 GB model it will not perform as well as the 512, 1TB and 2 TB models due to the single 256Gb chip instead of 2 128Gb chips (which was seen in the M1 256Gb edition), The benchmark I am reviewing is using the 512Gb version so it should not have any impact on the performance. With that over here is the overview; There is no Difference Between the microphones and webcams and it's a similar story for the speakers, but they cannot compare to the 16-inch holy grail that is its speakers. And finally, what you actually came here for, we are using Cinebench which is not best for macs, but it gives the most consistent results throughout. The M2 is predictably faster with the same number of cores as the M1. They have clearly upgraded something. We had the M1 with 7841 points and the M2 with 8737 points so quite a significant increase in performance.

We have also seen a new MacBook Air M2 edition but at the time of writing it has not yet been released. We have also seen sneak peaks of IOS 16, Watch OS 9, iPad OS 16, and Mac OS Ventura.

Cheese Straws

Makes: 14-16 Prep: 45 mins Cook: 10 mins - 15 mins Cooking temperature: 190°C


Ingredients:

- 4 oz plain flour
- 3 oz butter (room temperature)
- 2 oz mature cheddar grated
- 1 egg yolk
- Pinch of mustard


Method:

- Rub together the plain flour and the butter.
- Then add the cheddar and the mustard.
- Then add the egg yolk to bind the mixture together.
- Wrap the dough in clingfilm and chill for 30 mins.
- Roll the dough to the thickness of half a centimetre.
- Then cut into strips.
- Line a baking tray and place the dough strips onto the tray and brush them with milk (as a glaze).
- Then sprinkle generously with parmesan.
- Bake for 10-15 mins on 190°C.
- Leave to cool.




Draw a rough circle, then add a rounded bottom triangle below, around 1/3 to ½ of the circle. This is the chin.




Draw a horizontal line around halfway down the face this is the eye line, add one just above for the eyebrows, and a lower line for the nose. The forehead and the below the nose should be the distance between the eyebrows and nose.



Add some eyes on the eye line, if you inexperienced, two semi-ovals will do, with an oval I the middle. Add some eyebrows on the line above, and ears on the side between the nose and eye line, don't make them stick out! For a more realistic look, make the eyes a little smaller.





Draw an oval at the middle of the nose line, and two smaller one on each side, nostrils. Then draw a straight line from the inner eye past the nostril edge, this is the with of the mouth, draw in the mouth and lips between them, if you're doing a woman make the lips a little larger.



Add a hair outline halfway up the forehead, making it curve and rise on one side, above the high point is the crown. Draw the hair outline, larger than the head outline, dipping where the crown is, and flowing out from that point. If you are doing a woman continue the hair down past the ears, your free to do braid in the hair or just leave it loose. Remove the construction lines with a rubber, shade the eyes and draw in the ear lines and define any other areas that need to be done, like the hair strands. Then add the neck, the lines should be in line with the outer eye corner. The thicker the neck the older they look. Add line I am rough V-shape for their tenons if you character is thin. Then sit back and enjoy your masterpiece.
